Call for proposals for new members of the Danish Cancer Society's scientific committees

The Danish Cancer Society (DCS) invites institutions, institutes, and scientific societies that are actively involved in cancer research to submit proposals for six new members for the scientific committees of the DCS.

Each year the Central Board grants each committee a budget allocated in free competition to high quality, cancer-relevant research projects. On request, the committees may comment on questions or, on their initiative, make statements to the Executive Committee on professional matters within the committee's field of competence. The Central Board elects the new members based on a concise, professional nomination of candidates proposed by the scientific committees.

The two committees consist of Danish (60%) and international (40%) researchers and have 13 and 18 members, respectively, hereof two patient representatives in each committee. Each committee has three meetings a year. The Danish Cancer Society encourages researchers from foreign institutions to be nominated to ensure the committees' competencies to act.

The DCS' Scientific Committee - People & Society (KBVU-MS)

The committee covers the humanistic, social, public health and epidemiological cancer research area; and has three vacant member seats to be occupied by experienced, active researchers with the following expertise:

- Cancer epidemiologist 1 member
- Clinical nursing oncologist, preferably with a special focus on clinical intervention research 1 member
- Clinical oncologist 1 member

Hereof should at least two of them be from abroad and preferably be men to balance the committee's number of members from foreign institutions and the gender. The proposals for this committee can be written in Danish.

The DCS' Scientific Committee - Biology & Clinic (KBVU-BK)

The committee covers the biological, translational, clinical and epidemiological cancer research area; and has three vacant member seats to be occupied by experienced, active researchers with the following expertise:

- Radiation oncologist 1 member
- Basic scientist 1 member
- Clinical epidemiologist 1 member

Hereof should at least two of them be from abroad and preferably be women to balance the committee's number of members from foreign institutions and the gender. The proposals for this committee must be written in English.
